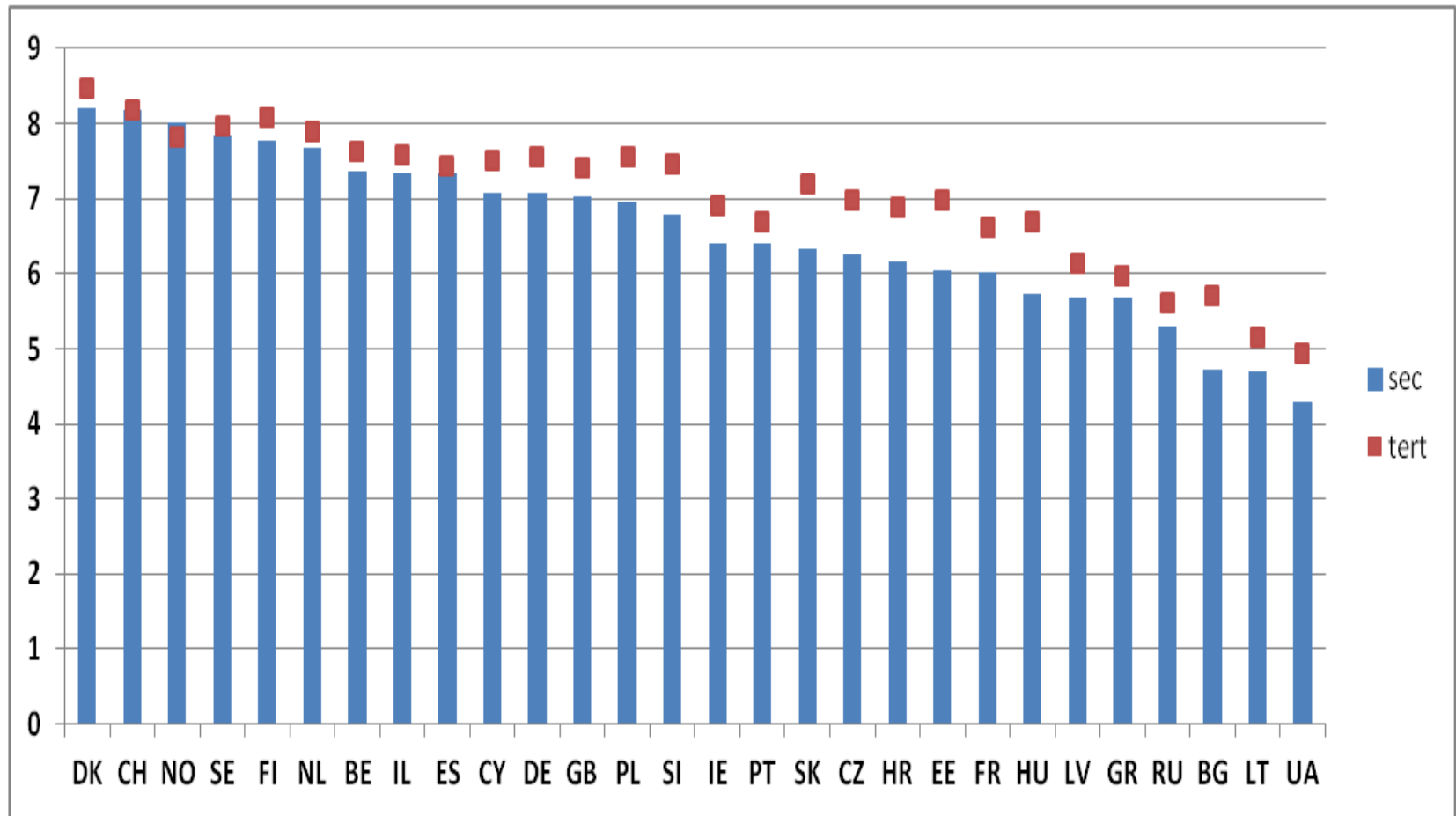

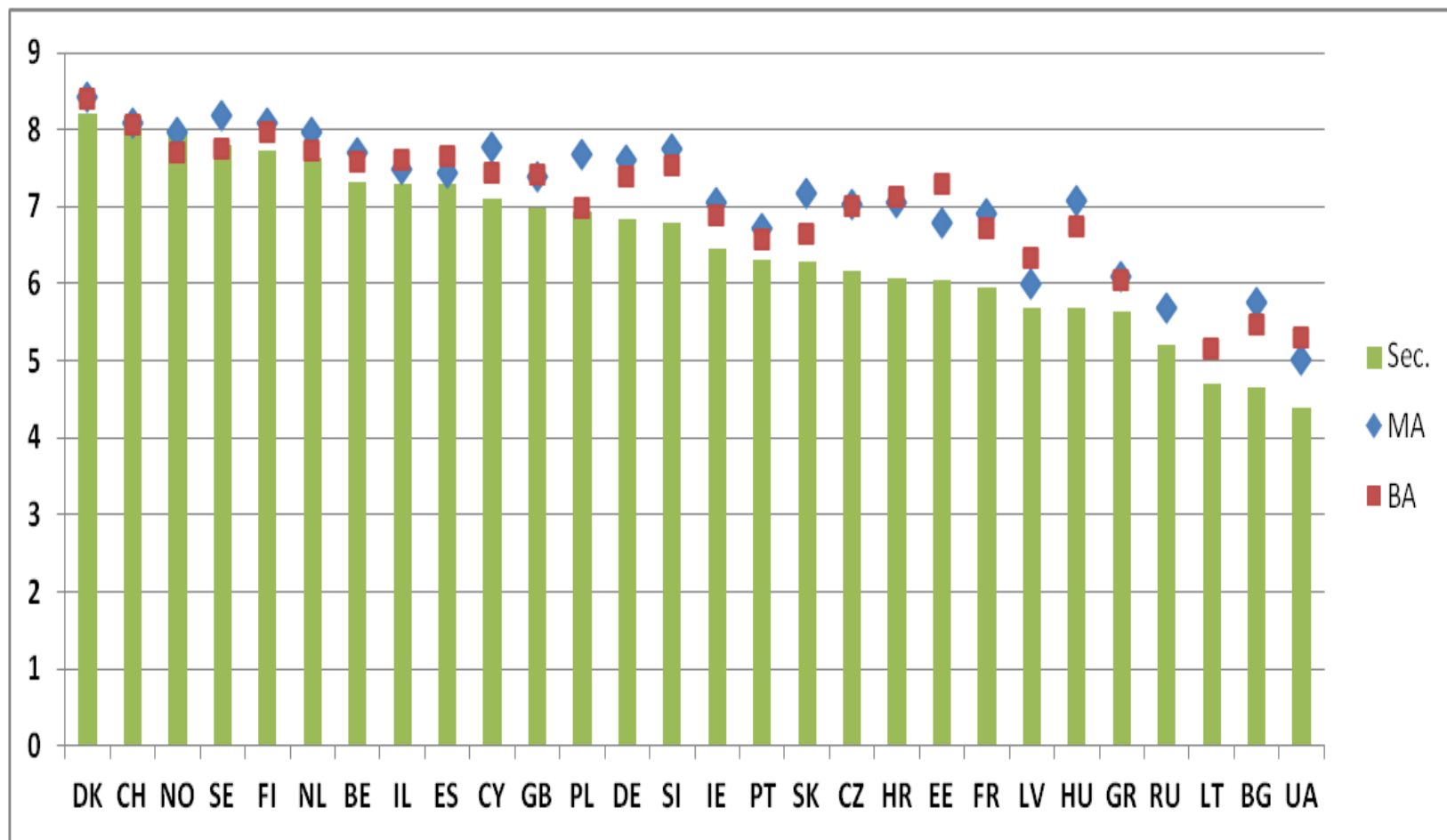

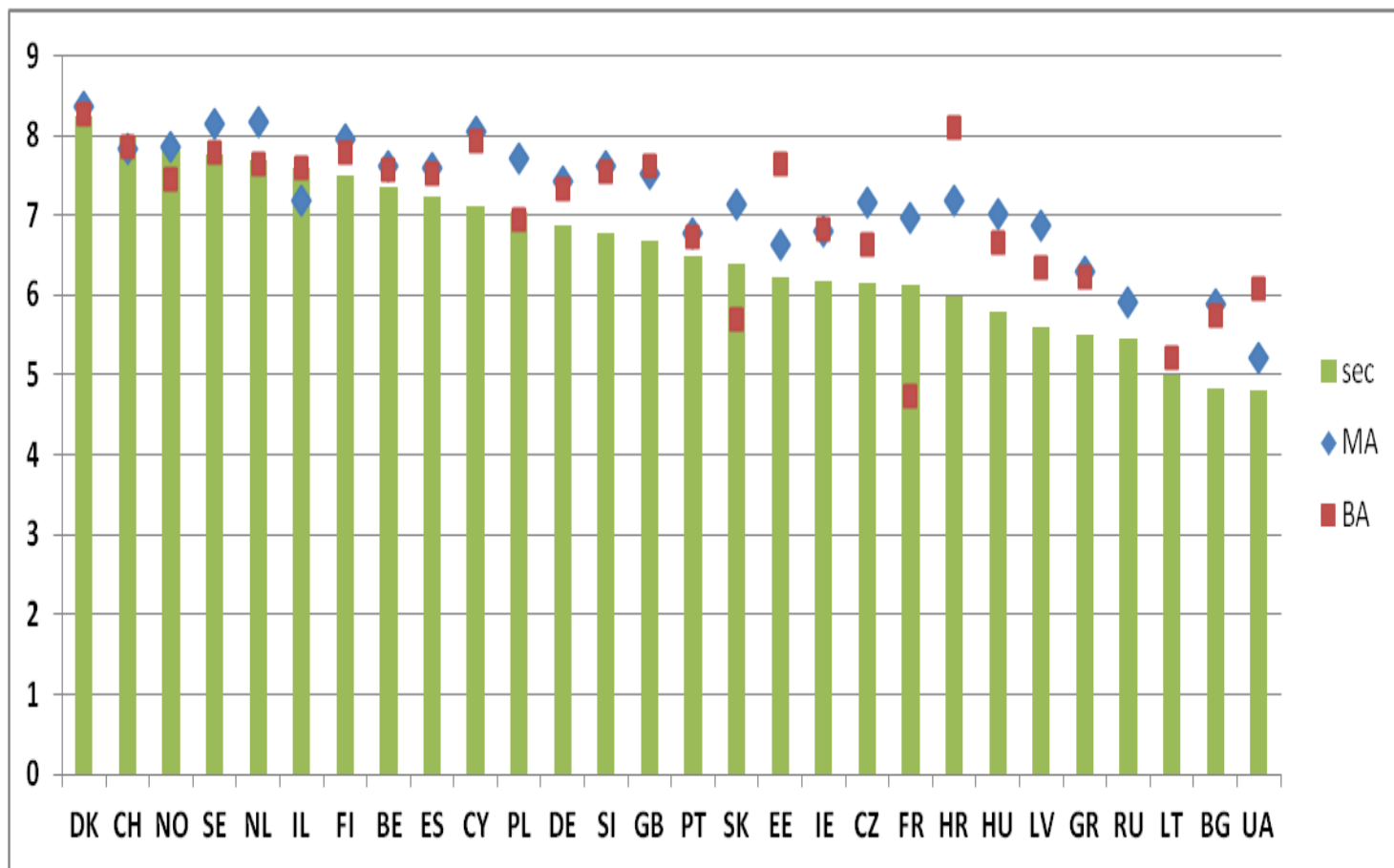
Average life satisfaction of population aged 25 and more with secondary and tertiary education, 2010-2011 (Latvia & Lithuania - 2009)



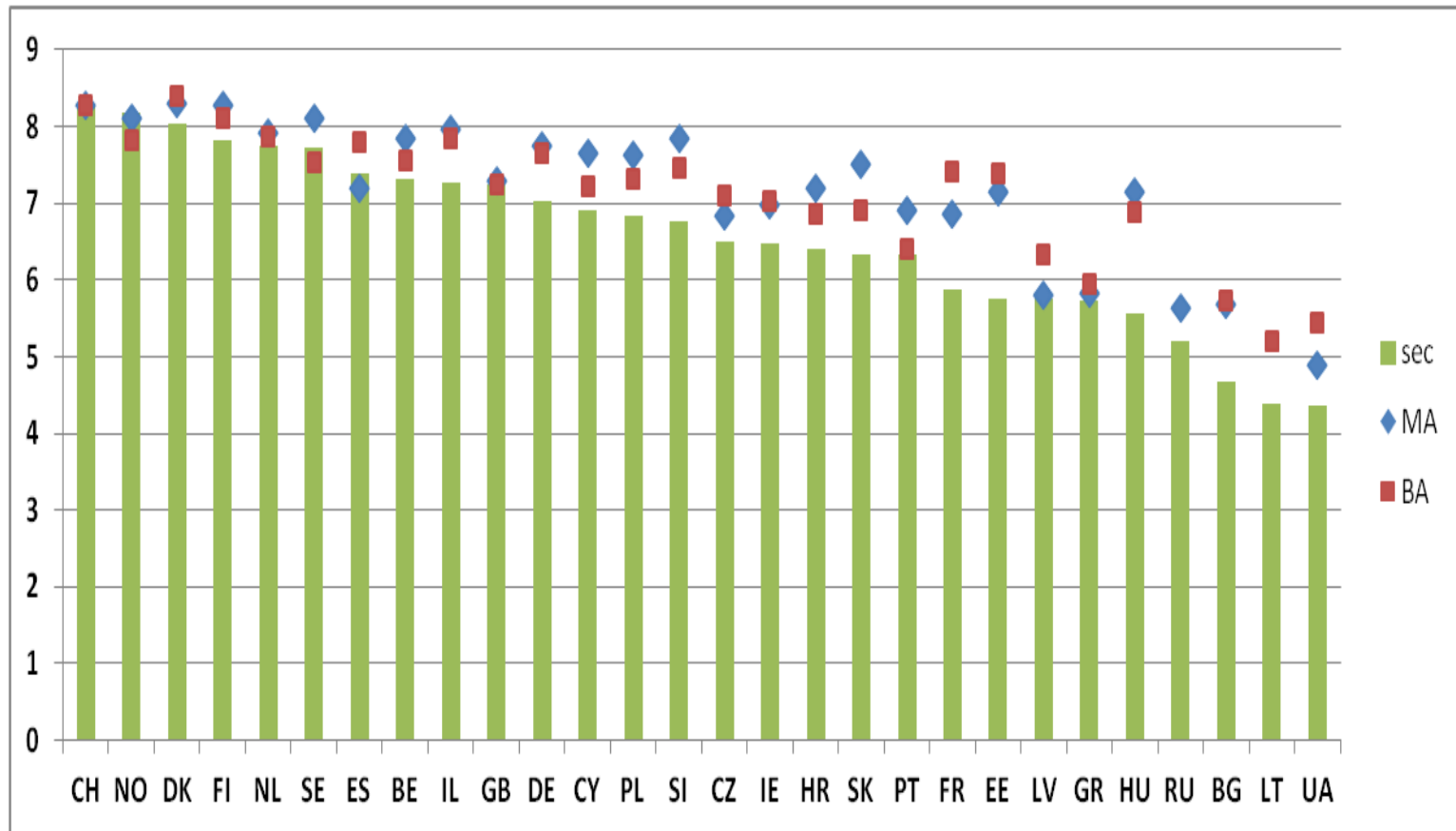
Average life satisfaction of population aged 25 and more with secondary and tertiary education, 2010-2011 (Latvia & Lithuania – 2009)



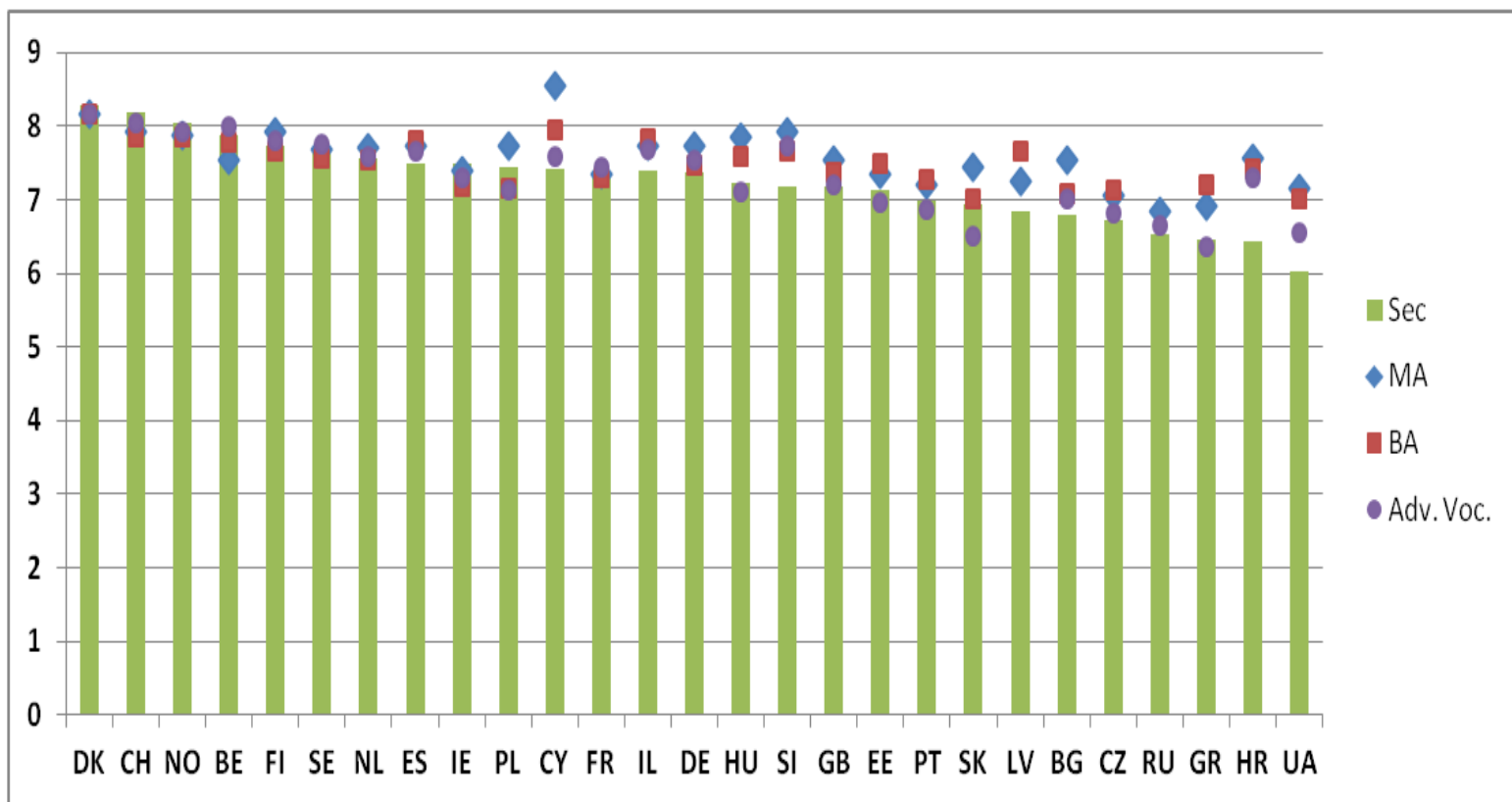
Average life satisfaction of men aged 25-64 with secondary and tertiary education, 2010-2011 (Latvia & Lithuania – 2009)
